Dear Brother.

I much wonder y^t I have receiv'd no Answer to my Last; You have often profess'd a great Desire of seeing me at London & I can't but say y^t my Affections would often times & during y^e my long Absence from my Friends have press'd me more earnestly to have sought an opportunity, not only of satisfying You, but to indulge that longing Desire of my self of seeing my Relations, had they not in some measure been satisfy'd by hearing from You & y^e rest of 'em, as well as by a some of y^e Advantages I should have mist had I left Tewkesbury any sooner.

I wrote to my Bro: Roswell about a fortnight ago, whereby I notify'd to him my design of leaving Tewkesbury, as also my Intention of going to Scotland, as soon as I could conveniently after I had taken my leave of my Friends: I desir'd him to acquaint my Grandmother with my Proposal, & to let me hear her Answer as soon as ever he could conveniently, but w^t he has done in y^e Matter I am altogether as yet unacquainted with not having receiv'd any Answer from him; I begin to fear lest my Letter miscarri'd, if it did I desire you would let me know as soon as you can; if Mr Roswell has receiv'd it & not Answer'd it before this comes to y^e hands, I desire you would acquaint him y^t I should think my self much oblig'd if he will do it as speedily, because my time is short. I am loth^{to} to trouble you with too long a Letter hoping shortly to have y^e happiness of seeing you & knowing my self w^t I now profess to be
