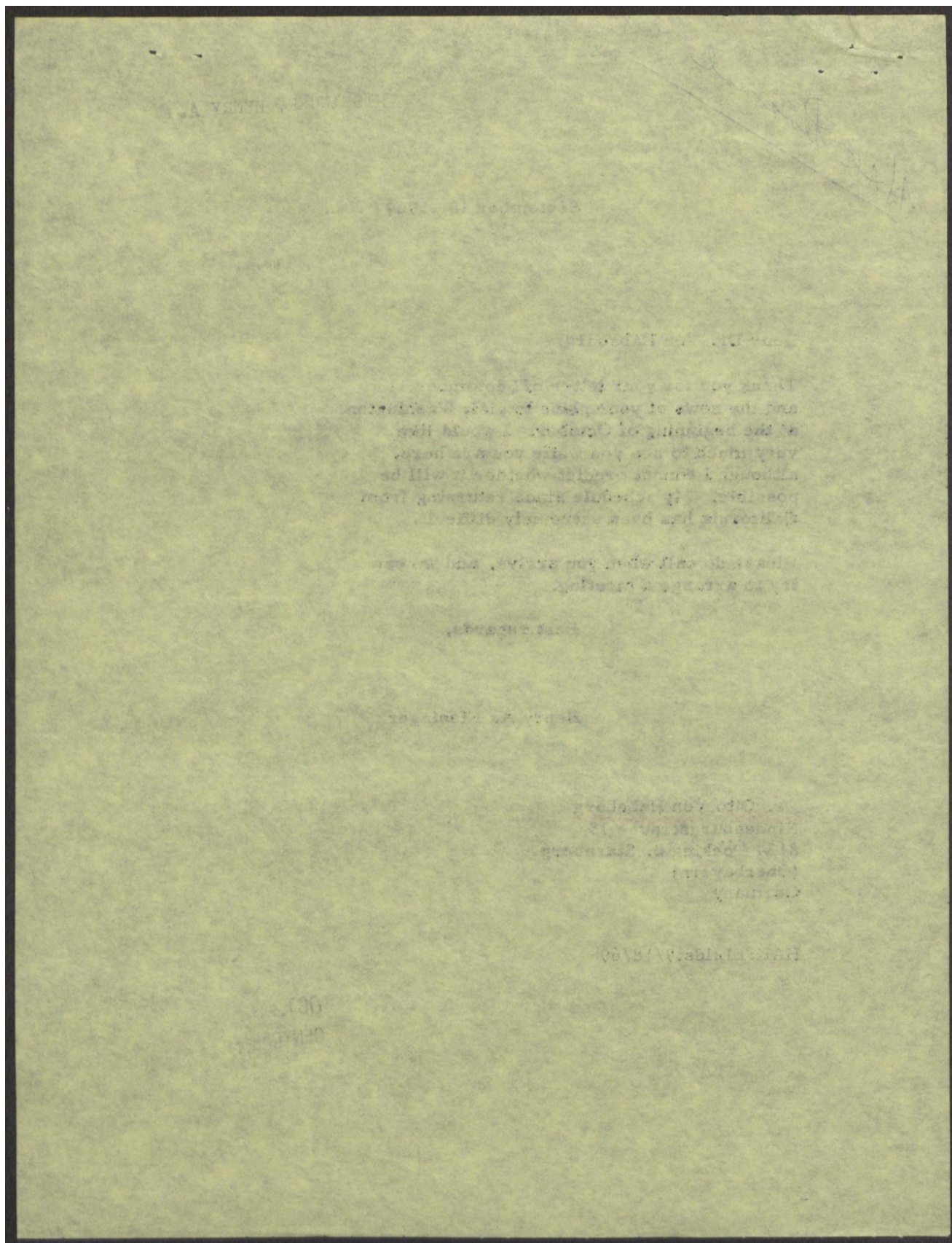

Dear Professor Kissinger,


When I last had the pleasure of seeing you in Washington in July you told me, that if I should come through Washington again, I should let you know it in advance. I now want to inform you that I shall leave Europe immediately following the German elections and shall arrive late on the evening of October 1st in Washington. I shall plan to stay there till the morning of October 4th when I am leaving for Tokyo on a Far Eastern trip, in the course of which I shall visit Japan, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Free China and several other places. While in Washington I shall stay at the Watergate Hotel.

Knowing how busy you are, I want to emphasize that I have nothing in particular for you. The matter of the policies on the Vatican and of the service of information, which might be mounted there, is something which is still under study. We are gathering a big documentation on the matter, which is going to be studied collectively by the working group at a meeting, which will be held at Mr. Strauss' house on November 2nd. After that it will be submitted to you.

Nevertheless since you told me to inform you in advance, may I tell you that I shall be in Washington and that of course I should be delighted if an opportunity would arise to come and greet you. On the other hand I want to stress that I of course would understand if you were much too busy in these days and in your numerous activities to see me, the more so since I have no particular question to discuss with you.

Dear Professor Kissinger,

You will perhaps remember, that I had, roughly a year ago, the opportunity to send you a note of introduction for the Spanish Minister of Public Works Federico Silva Muñoz. I had then the opportunity to write to you that in my opinion he was the man with the greatest political future in the country. By a chain of confusions on his part, Silva did not have the pleasure of meeting you.

Since then Silva left the government, to become the head of CAMPSA, the state petroleum monopoly. He has not given up politics and is today the closest adviser to Prince Juan Carlos, heir apparent to Chief of State Franco. Many people consider him as the first Prime Minister of the Prince, something which would be quite logical. In any case as a young man with a huge personal following, it is still my opinion that Silva is the best bet for the country's future.

Now Silva will be coming to Washington, at the invitation of Christian Leadership to attend the Presidential Prayer Breakfast. On this occasion he will be in Washington on January 31st and February 1st, staying either at the Spanish Embassy or at the Hilton. He would be extremely grateful if you could see him. On January 25th or soon after that, his trusted collaborator José Luis Mora will arrive in the USA and will take the liberty to phone to your office to inquire about a possible hour if you could see him.

May I add the suggestion that, if possible, I would take the liberty to suggest that if you have the time, you receive him. It is a good investment in future American-Spanish relations. Furthermore he is really interesting and worth while.

I take this opportunity to wish you everything best for the year 1972 and great success in your work so crucial for us all. I am, dear Professor Kissinger

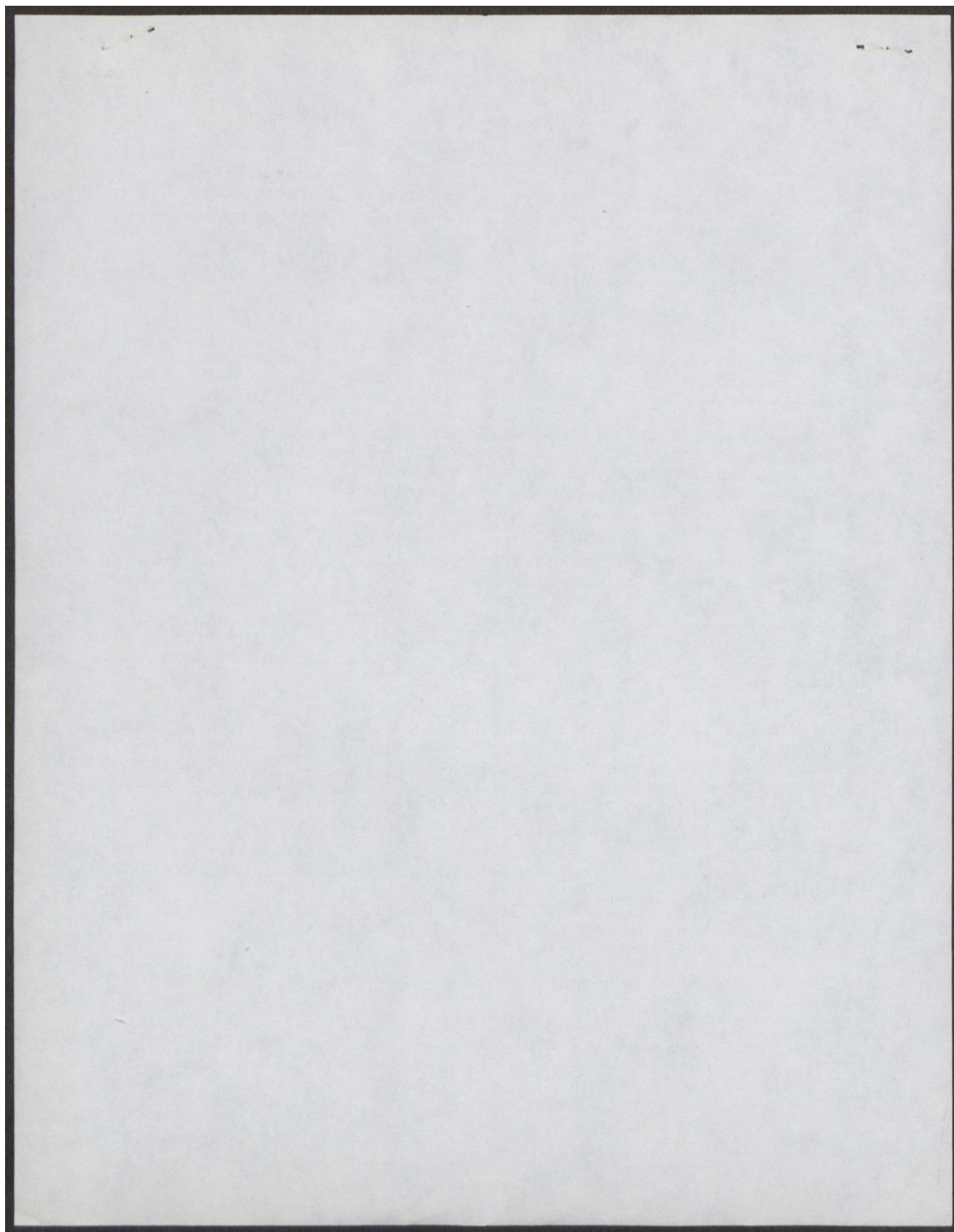

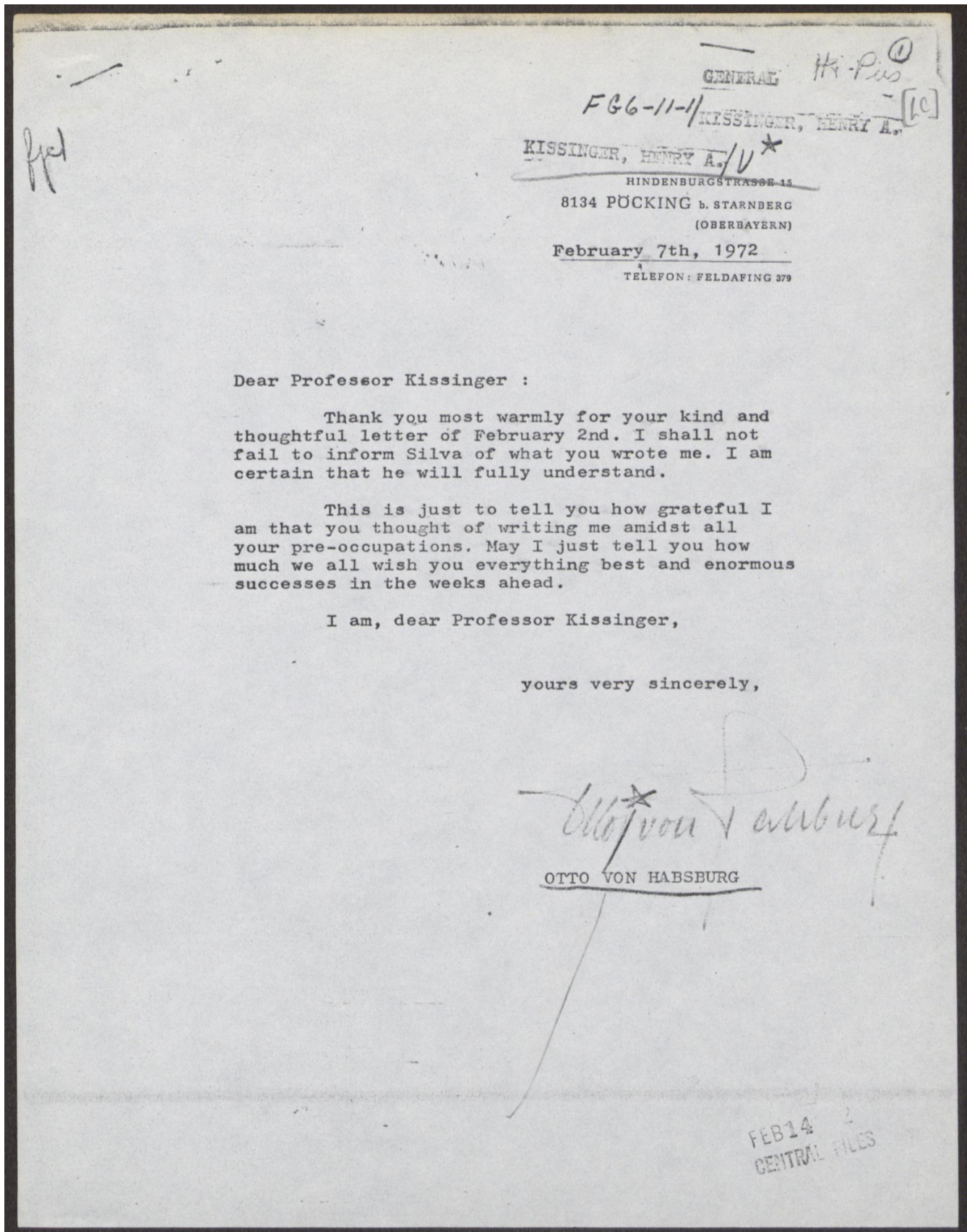

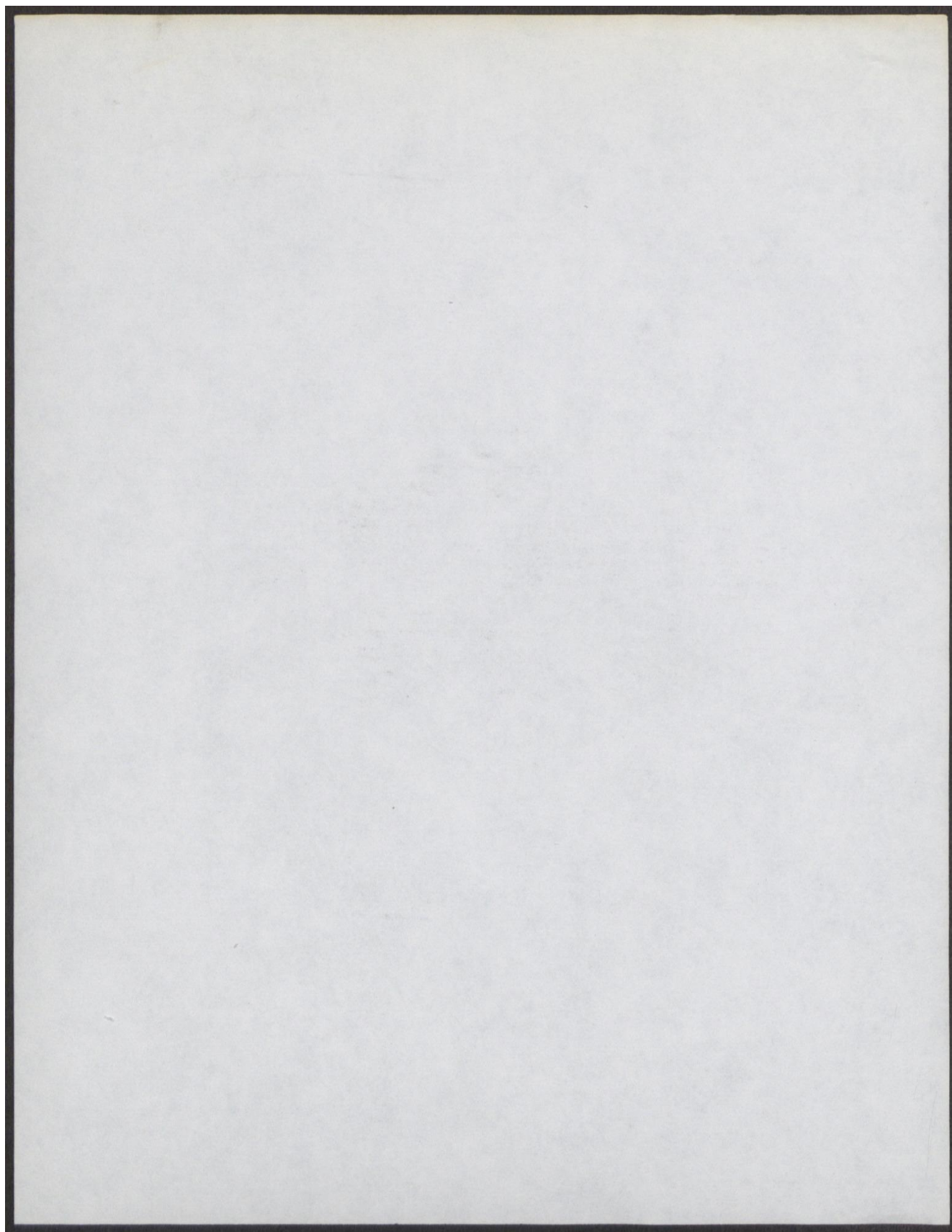
