Our Demand against Zachariah Endreas is for £600. specie, lent to  
Ludwick Steine & Reinhart Kammer in 1774 & 1775, which he afterwards  
obligated himself to pay, also for £200. Continental Money lent himself in  
1778.

The following are the Facts. —

Feb'y. 2<sup>nd</sup> 1774 — Steine & Kammer borrowed £350. of the Directors and gave  
a Bond & Mortgage on a New House & Ground fronting Vine and  
Wood Street.

On the  
6<sup>th</sup> Jan'y. 1775 — Kammer borrowed £250. and gave his Bond & Mortgage  
on his undivided Moiety of said Premises.

In 1778, soon after the British left this City Kammer was  
about to sell his half of this Estate to Zachariah Endreas, when they  
were in treaty about the Sale, Christopher Ludwick who is Father in  
Law to Kammer and was joined with him in the Bond, informed  
the said Endreas, that £600. of the purchase money must be paid to  
the Directors of the Fire Insurance in specie, and their Bonds taken up  
which Endreas agreed to do, but not being able to raise the money to  
pay off the Mortgage and take up the Bonds as agreed, he applied to  
the Directors by his Attorney Lewis Weis to take his security in the  
Room of Steine & Kammer for their Debt, and also to borrow £200.  
more. — The Directors to serve said Endreas and enable him to  
complete his purchase, agreed to take his security for their Debt, and to  
lend him £200. — which sum of £200. — the Treasurer paid him  
in pursuance of an Order from the Directors as appears by his Receipt.

That the Debt of £600. — contracted by Steine & Kammer in 1774  
& 1775. is an old Debt, cannot admit of a doubt being clearly proved  
to be such by the Order for £200. — in which it is expressed that £600.  
of the Money for which said Endreas has given security was in Lieu of  
Steine & Kammer's Mortgage —

When Execution was levied against Zach. Endreas he came into  
Court and declared this £600. to be Continental Money, and by his Lawyer  
prayed to have the Judgment & Execution set aside, but when the Directors  
proved their Facts, the Court did not hesitate to confirm both Judgment  
and Execution. — But the Law requiring the Award of Auditors, when  
Bath is made that there is dispute concerning the Depreciation of Continen-  
tal Money, no further proceedings can be had until that is done —
