FELLOW CITIZENS,

Your arrival here, on your way to the seat of war, is doubly cheering; your appearance will assure the inhabitants that the people at the east, will rush to their assistance, and strengthen the force in the field.

Our general will be compelled to retreat without a speedy reinforcement, which if he receives, our country east of the Colorado will escape the ravages of the enemy. We understand you came from a country of plenty, and by thus timely flying to our assistance, your families may enjoy the quietness of home. Your speedy arrival at camp will gladden the hearts of your countrymen. You may expect toil and hardships, but with discipline and good subordination you will conquer our enemies, for which you may expect the gratitude of a grateful people.

The Convention, we learn, have secured every person in their rights to a quantity of land equal to that guaranteed to them by the laws of colonization, with an augmentation for extra services.
