By Aug. 1, a copy was in Vailima. p.76 R.L.S. s complaining of error pp 548 549 The W<sub>r</sub>ecker.

Dec. 1891-- The W<sup>R</sup>ecker done, he hears from Burlingame he likes it.

Aug. 1, 1892 R.L.S. complains of error on pp.548-549 the separation of a Latin quotation by a line of English text ; the same error occurs in the English ed. p.424--

but the strange thing is that the correction is made in the magazine issue-- Scribners, July 1892, p.75.

This looks as though the book was in sheets before the July issue of Scribner's was; and that the English edition was printed from the text of the American ed. ~~ed.~~

The correction was made in the "Edinburgh Edition-- but not in the Thistle. The correction was made in the Vailima ed. in the Swanston, Pentland, The S. Seas, etc.

That the Amer. ed. is first seems likely from the advertisement in the Eng. ed-- if one is going by advertisements, for in them, p.3, a review of The Wrecker by Lang is quoted. Did he review an American ed? or this English copy of ours a second binding "or something."
