NOTE: This sheet has been drawn on the north meridian. All points through
lines of declination were not surveyed but were determined from observations
made by Cassin and Mearns, and from their astronomical observations. The
declination for 1858 was 13° 30' N. The magnetic declination for 1858 was 12° 30' W.
and the true bearing of the meridian was 74° 30' E. It is to be noted that
the declination and true bearing were determined at the point of observation.
