George I. James, cousin of the first Duke of Devonshire, was born in 1686, at the age of 19, he took part in the battle of Sedgley against the Duke of Marlborough, and from 1721 to 1722 he was Warden and Captain of the Tower of London, where he died of pleurisy in 1722. He was a member of the House of Commons, and in 1722 he was given command of the expedition which he commanded to Tangier, to maintain the garrison and destroy the fortifications.

He had long been a close friend and devoted supporter of James, Duke of York, and when the latter succeeded to the Throne, Daremouth became Major-General, and was appointed to the command of the expedition to the Philippines, which he performed in the Tower of London, where he died of pleurisy in 1722.
