Sir:

Your letter of the 8th inst., concerning Gilbert Parkhurst having shut a road from Susan Powell's house to main road &c -

To day I went to see the road and fence in question and found that the road was fenced and nailed, I then went to see Gilbert ^{Parkhurst} and ordered him to make a pair of bars so that a team can get to Susan Powell's when wanted. He answered that he will not do it because it is his land and that Susan can get to the main road by fixing another road that would go ^{around} further south come out to the main road between Thos Dattler and Horvost Stevens' farm -

I told him that I have to carry out the instructions that a pair of bars should be made - He said he will write to you and explain the whole matter -

The way he proposes to have for Susan's road is perhaps four times further than this ^{old} road leading from her farm to main road - If she is to have a road this old road is the straightest and the shortest - but the way Gilbert proposes
