Tset lat Cints a remarkable boulder of conglomerate rock on the south side of North Island, in Parri Passage. Queen Charlotte Islands, E.C. On top of this bowl shaped rock is a small house frame with a carved column in front to commemorate a chief who was buried there some 100 years ago whose name was Tset lan jo the indian name for the devils walking stick (Panax homdum - Tset lat Cints means the burial place or mausoleum of Tset lan jo.
