The troops ascended the long and difficult slope of Cerro Gordo without shelter and under the tremendous fire of artillery and musketry, with the utmost steadiness, reached the breastworks where the enemy from them, planted the colors of the 1st, 3d, 5th and 7th Infantry — the enemy's flag still flying — and after some minutes of sharp firing crushed the conquest with the bayonet. About 3000 men laid down their arms with the usual proportion of field and company officers, besides five generals, several of them of great distinction — Brown, Juarez, de Vera, Neriaga, and Obando. About 3000 stands of arms, and 43 pieces of artillery, were taken.
