To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, at the July term, A. D., 1862, of the Criminal Court of the District of Columbia, one Andrew Jones was convicted of resisting an officer of the law and sentenced to imprisonment in the District Jail for the period of four months;—

And whereas, it is credibly shewn that the said Andrew Jones was not guilty of any malicious intent, but was defending himself against undue violence on the part of the officer whom he resisted.

Now therefore, be it known, that I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, divers other good and sufficient reasons me therunto moving, have granted and do hereby grant unto him, the said Andrew Jones, a full and unconditional pardon.

In testimony whereof, I have herunto signed my name and caused the Seal of the United States to be affixed.
