A Description of the Island Barbuda.

This Island Barbuda lieth N. from the Island Antigua, being a low flat Island; and off the SW. Point there lieth a Shoal a long Way off; and off the NNW. Point lieth another Shoal, or Spit of Sand, a great Way off into the Sea; and on the W. side is a good Road, where you may ride in 9, 12, or 14 Fath. Water.

A Description of the Island Nevis.

The Island Nevis reacheth NNE. and SSW. nearest, and is about three Leagues in Length, the Eastermost Part of the

Island seemeth to be full of Trees, and when you come South and North thwart of the same, in the Middle is the high Land, with a Saddle; and on the SW. side it is full of Rocks and Shoals, and when you are off the Island North from it, you will see a fair plain Shore, on which stand many withered Trees; and near the same are many green Trees; by these last is very good fresh Water, which runneth from two Brooks into the Sea. The Appearance of the Island is as followeth.
