Thursday 11 Apr. 1776
 About 5th PM came into the Harbor & anchored
 between Row Gold & Town. — The Scarborough Man o' War of
 20 G. a large Transport Ship of 18 G, a Brig belonging to
 the late loaded with Bread & Flour & a sloop belonging to the
 Colony loaded with salt. In the Evening Commodore Grimes
 with the two Gallies under his Command attacked the
 Scarborough & Transport Ship, ^{at 7 o'clock} to facilitate the Attack had
 ordered some Cannon to be sent on, & was greatly annoyed the
 Enemy & obliged them to cut Cable, & leave the Brig & Sloop
 in the hands of Commodore Grimes with their Crew
 consisting of 13 men. We are informed that Sir James Wright
 Gov of Georgia & his Family with many other Tories are
 on board the Scarborough. Cap^t Myer behaved with great
 Firmness: His 2nd Lt^t Mr Fillingham is very dangerously
 wounded. These Vessels in Company with others fr. w they
 were parted in a gale of Wind were bound to Boston.
 they not knowing it to be in the power of the Americans."

Sailed for Savannah 30 March. — The fleet had another
 Transport that is not arrived — the ^{Bark} Transport had about 200
 Marins The 200 B. Car. have taken
 possession of Georgia — Gov Wright was also taken but escaped.
